I remember that evening Nancy Mercado and Danny Shot brought him over. Each reader had five to six minutes on stage to read from Bukowski's work. I announced this at the beginning of the evening. When the time came for Miguel to read, he read all his own poems and stayed on stage for several more minutes. I was standing below the stage pointing to my watch but he just continued reading. He was a big success and finished to much applause. He was so good I

couldn't be angry with him. I later thought it was a very Bukowski-like thing to do.
